
The TAA was well represented last month at the second annual Mile High Open Bid Calling Contest in Denver, CO. All three Texas entries made the finals, with Angie Meier, Troy Robinett, and Toya McLeod finishing fifth, second, and first, respectively.

The Mile High Open was launched in 2019 by the Colorado Auctioneers Foundation in conjunction with the Colorado Auctioneers Association. The format of the contest is much like the Texas Lone Star Open, with contestants selling 3 items in the preliminary round. The top five contestants from the preliminary advance to the finals, where they sell four items. It is held in conjunction with the National Western Stock Show, and has quickly become a top notch event, offering \$10,000 in total prize money, including a \$5000 first place prize.

Your TLSO co-founders, Joel Lemley and Troy Robinett, developed a contest format that has caught fire across the nation, with similar events being held in Denver, Kentucky, and Iowa in 2020. TLSO still reigns supreme, as the highest

paying contest of its' kind, offering a \$10,000 first place prize. The large prize pools and omission of an interview portion attracts top auctioneers from across the nation.





PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY vs. General Liability

Did you know there is a coverage difference between Professional Liability and General Liability insurance? Carrying one without the other could leave your business open to potential uncovered exposures and claims.

Professional Liability, also known as Errors and Omissions, provides coverage for actual or alleged damage arising from the rendering, or not rendering, of your business's services. This type of insurance is related to the service or services you perform as a business. It can protect against claims for a professional mistake, an opinion or recommendation offered by an employee, services not meeting a customer's standards, or negligence in performing a service. Professional Liability is generally related to financial loss.

One of the main ways General Liability protects a business owner is from claims against a customer suffering bodily injury while on the premises or damage to property arising from your business operations. Slip and falls are common claims that trigger the General Liability policy. It also provides coverage for property damage, reputational harm, advertising errors and medical payments to third parties. General Liability protects against physical injury or damages.

Both insurance policies protect a business against liability claims, the difference is the type of liability involved.



The PATH, International, Veterinarian of the year was awarded to Dr. Patrick Breen on November 9, at the PATH, Intl, annual meeting in Denver Colorado.

Veterinarians are a vital part of any center's team. But some go beyond and become part of the family. Dr. Patrick Breen, who has been with ROCK for more than 18 years, is just such a veterinarian.

He has treated horses, donated, side-walked, horse-handled, and invested in healing for all: participants-including his daughter-, staff, volunteers and horses. He is a guest lecturer in EAAT class at Texas A&M University, helping to educate future generations about the importance of the horse-human connection. He serves on the Board of Directors, currently as Vice President. AND he even volunteers as ROCK's official auctioneer, raising money at events.

He has countless times guided and directed decisions for the best care of not only the equine partners but also the center. For example, a dog was donated to the center that had a tumor and heartworms. Dr. Breen saw the value this dog would have for the program and so performed surgery and all care to treat the heartworms.

Recently, he created a magnetic board to re-create the trail pattern for one of the riders who is blind. This allowed her to understand the trail pattern before getting on the horse and entering the arena.

A member of ROCK said, "Most would never know all the behind the scenes work, care, and love Dr. Breen puts in to all our two- and four-legged patients. I cannot say enough about what he has done for our center and the industry as a whole."

TAA Board of Directors Eligibility

TAA Bylaws Article VI, Section 2

- 2. Election and Term of Office. The elective officers of the non-profit Association, except the President and Immediate Past President, shall be elected annually by the members, immediately before the election of the Directors. The President-Elect shall become the President of the Association the year following his election as President-Elect. The President shall become the Immediate Past President of the Association the year following his term as President. No elected officer shall service more than two consecutive terms in the same office except the Secretary/Treasurer which shall have no term limits. Officers of the Association shall be elected for terms of One (1) year and by such election shall be elected members of the Board of Directors for the same term. Each officer shall hold office until his successor shall have been duly elected and shall have qualified or until his death or until he shall resign or shall have been removed in the manner hereinafter provided. No elected officer shall serve more than Two (2) consecutive terms in the same office. 6/10/00
 - (a) Eligibility. Nominees for the Offices of President, President-Elect or 1st Vice President and 2nd Vice President must have been a Texas Licensed Auctioneer for Two (2) years and must have completed a minimum of Two (2) years as Director of the TAA. Nominees for the office of Secretary/Treasurer must have been a Texas Licensed Auctioneer for Two (2) years and must have completed a minimum of Two (2) years as a Director of the TAA or previously served in the capacity of Secretary/Treasurer for the TAA. Nominees for Director must have been a Texas Licensed Auctioneer for Two (2) years and attended Two (2) consecutive TAA Conventions prior to year of nomination. Eligibility of all nominees will be verified by the Executive Director. *Revised 6/17/06/6/16/12*
 - (b) Elections. At the annual business meeting, the President shall call out and post the final list of candidates and the offices they seek. In addition, nominations from the floor may be presented at the annual convention meeting provided that the candidate's eligibility to serve has been verified by the Executive Director. The President shall then call for a vote by the membership for each candidate. Revised 6/16/12


